

The **verb class** is seen in the ending on the future tense for each verb.

The future tense form is used in the **dictionary** for all verbs, to show the verb class.

The future tense can have the meaning **will**, e.g. will eat, will hop. It can also have the meaning **might/could**, e.g. might eat, could hop.

We refer to the **command form** since it is technically mood, rather than tense.

An exception is the command form of the Gamilaraay verb yana-y (will) walk, come, qo, which is **yana-nga**. The Yuwaalaraay/Yuwaalayaay word is yanaa-y,

The present continuous tense means something **happening now**, e.g. I am eating, or something which **always/often happens**, e.g. (I) eat (bread for lunch). It also shows **ability**, e.g. can eat, can swim, can dance.

was/were giving

keep giving!

The non-moving continuous tenses are used when something happens without moving, i.e. **on the spot.**

will be giving

The moving continuous tenses are used when something happens while it is in linear motion, i.e. while walking/running/being carried along. They can also show a change of state/situation, or that something is beginning to happen.



is/am/are giving
