Note:

The pronoun usually goes second, but with body parts (which have ngaya 'I' instead of ngay 'my') it goes first.

Pronunciation hints:

- The word stress is usually on the first syllable
- The stress changes if there is a double vowel
- If a rolled 'rr' is difficult, you can substitute it with a 'd'
